## Session 2: Aquatic Vegetation Growth and Algae

 Presentation: What is Algae? Why is it in my lake? Causes and effects of algae blooms on lake environments – Bev Clark, Ministry of the Environment

Bev Clark coordinates the Ministry of the Environment Lake Partner Program which uses volunteers to monitor phosphorus and water clarity in lakes throughout Ontario. Bev has recently been involved in lake water quality projects that examine the link between nutrients and lake productivity, and the impacts of trophic interactions and invading species.

• Aquatic vegetation: Strategies for dealing with aquatic vegetation on lakes and the permitting process

#### Session 3: Septic Re-inspection Programs

 Presentation/Case Study: 3-Mile Lake Septic Re-inspection Program – Sandy Bos, Township of Muskoka Lakes

Starting in 1981, Sandy Bos inspected sewage systems under Ontario's Cottage Pollution Control Program. In 1998, Sandy Bos began working for the Township of Muskoka Lakes as a Building Inspector (Onsite Sewage Systems). Before joining the Township of Muskoka, Sandy created BOS Environmental Consulting.
