

Bursary Award

The Friends of the Tay Watershed have announced the recipient of their annual Water Guardian Bursary for 2019. The presentation was made to Amanda Miller on Saturday, August 17th, in a ceremony at the Association's annual Watershed Discovery Day at the Perth Farmers' Market. Miss Miller is a graduate of the Perth and District Collegiate Institute and currently a student at Queen's University in Kingston. The \$1000. bursary will help her continue with her program of major in Environmental Science and minor in Geography.

Every year, since 2011, the Friends of the Tay Watershed have extended an invitation to students at local high schools, and, recently, university students who attended a local high school, to submit applications for this bursary. Candidates wishing to apply should watch for notices from the Association next February in local papers and high schools for application requirements.
